3 Day/ 2 Night Tour

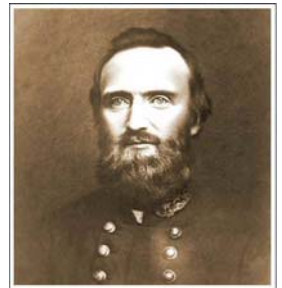
Staunton, Winchester, Cross Keys, Front Royal



The Shenandoah Valley stretches 200 miles across the Blue Ridge and Allegheny mountains. It's been nicknamed "The Big Valley" and immortalized in song, dance, film and television. The History & Heritage of the region includes many sites devoted to the pioneers who traveled westward, settled and farmed the fertile valley. During the Civil War, this region was nicknamed "The Breadbasket of the Confederacy."

The tour will introduce you to residents of the Shenandoah Valley and their stories when they lived here. You will meet **Belle Boyd** a notorious Confederate spy whose help saved the Valley during the Civil War. You will also meet **Stonewall Jackson**, via tour, a famous Confederate General. An unpopular professor at VMI whose popularity as a leader has been matched by few throughout history. A passionate man whose love for his wife was well known.

Also meet via tour the **Widow Pence** whose farm is located on Port Republic Road and is situated on a part of the historic **Cross Keys Battlefield**. Here on June 8, 1862 the Confederates launched a surprise attack against the Union. Widow Pence found herself that day in the middle of the Civil War. What happened to her, the farm and the family will be answered at a special dinner to be held on this privately owned property. A rare treat.



Woodrow Wilson, born in 1856 in Staunton became our 28th President and led our country while engaged in the WWI. A visit to his birthplace and library is fascinating. **Turner Ashby**, the "Black Night" of the Confederacy a dashing character, known to smile a lot was a very popular gentleman. Learn about his exploits in the Shenandoah Valley.
